


The Kelliwik Music Festival

CALLINGTON MEMORY CAFÉ



The Cafe, which is run by volunteers and supported by the Rotary Club of Callington, operates on a drop-in basis. It offers a relaxed, friendly and welcoming atmosphere where people affected by dementia and memory loss, and their carers, can get together regularly to support each other and develop friendships with others facing problems similar to themselves.

At the fortnightly meetings, information and practical tips about coping with memory loss are available. There is the opportunity to take part in stimulating, reminiscence based activities, games, quizzes and discussions, or visitors can just enjoy socialising with cake and refreshments. The informal setting aims to provide emotional support and help in reducing the pressures and sense of isolation that is often felt by people with dementia and their carers and families.

Callington Community College Ten Tors success

On Friday 8th May, after months of training, two teams of youngsters from Callington Community College set off from Callington to Okehampton Army Camp to take part in the Ten Tors Challenge on Dartmoor.

Ten Tors Challenge takes place annually in May and is limited to 2,400 individuals – four hundred teams of six teenagers. The teams, depending on age, face hikes of 35, 45 or 55 miles (56, 72 or 88km) visiting ten nominated Tors over two days. The teams must be self-sufficient, carrying all that they need to complete their route safely despite the terrain and the weather. The latter can be very changeable and at times quite extreme, and success or failure can depend very much on the extent to which a team has been trained for all eventualities. The Challenge starts at 7.00am on the Saturday morning and all teams must be back across the finish line by 5.00pm on the Sunday afternoon.





Great partnership working with the Police has meant that those responsible for the on-going graffiti and vandalism at one of the parks have been identified and are being suitably reprimanded. We hope this gives the clear message that anti-social behaviour is not tolerated in our Town and action will be taken where necessary. The synergy between the Town Council and the Police is great in our Town. The two authorities are increasingly working together to tackle matters for the safety of you all.

If you see or fear anything, no matter how small, please do come in and report it to the Town Hall or the Police. Don't forget that Police surgeries are held in the Town Hall foyer every other Monday morning between 9am – 11am, so come along and have a chat with your PCSOs.

Your Safety is Paramount

At the time of writing this article we have taken the decision to close off the skate park at Saltash Road to complete some maintenance works. Hopefully everything should be back up and running very soon. We are taking advice from the manufacturers on getting some minor safety matters addressed but hope that you will appreciate and understand that it is the sensible and responsible option to take, for the safety of the public.

Peggy's Patch

For those residents that live on or near Guipavas Road, Coombe Road and Inney Close vicinity, you are probably very familiar with the open space area known locally as Peggy's Patch. This area has previously been under the ownership and responsibility of Cornwall Council but residents have increasingly reported the perceived lack of attention and its neglect. The Town Council has taken the decision to adopt the land and have added it to our regular park inspections which includes a daily litter pick. This demonstrates our ongoing commitment to look after things in our town. However, the hedges around this open space are the responsibility of the neighbouring properties and not the Town Council. This point has been clarified by a legal land search on the area.

A Reminder about the Grass Cutting

The Town Council has the contract for cutting the grass verges for the town, the former contractor was Cormac. If you have a verge near your home and want to clarify who is responsible for cutting it, please take a look at the maps which are located on the notice boards by the Lloyds Chemists in Fore Street. These maps show where the Town Council staff will be cutting grass (shown on the maps) and all other areas will be the responsibility of the property/land owner.




