

'The Mystery of the Royal letters' written by Jane Black

On a dismal January day we were cheered by a very professional and entertaining talk by Janet Cowlard. Janet, who had an interest in the Royal family, was delighted when her husband bought, at a stamp auction, five letters written from various royal residences. None of the letters had envelopes or a clue who they were from. Some had dates but no year, and only through thorough research did Janet find out the years they were written. She was able to do this by the events mentioned in the letters. For instance one

black edged letter, used after a bereavement, brought her to conclude it was in memory of Empress Eugenie, so she had a clue about what year it was written. Janet even wrote to our late Queen Mother for information as to who might have written them.



The letters from a mother to her daughter were full of local gossip, news of weddings, and of shopping trips with Queen Mary. Janet told us about the Queen being careless about acquiring items she coveted, sometimes even resorting to kleptomania! Our present Queen Elizabeth has in fact returned many of the treasures to their rightful owners. Much more careful research and background checks led to the conclusion that the letters were from Lady Elizabeth Dawson to her daughter Kaitilin. Lady Elizabeth was appointed as a Lady of the Royal Bedchamber in the early 1920s. In her position she was able to tell her daughter of happenings at court, and of

visits to Sandringham and Balmoral. We heard about the clothes and jewellery of guests, family sickness, and their connections to European royalty. Lady Elizabeth died aged 55, a short while after she fell and broke her hip while out walking at Balmoral. Her daughter Kaitilin went on to marry into the aristocracy and became the mother of an alleged notorious murderer. We were asked not to reveal the end of Janet's story, so you will have to watch for one of her talks, and be surprised at what a load of research and five hand written letters can reveal.

Exploration Drilling In Kelly Bray
Historic Mining Area

You are probably already aware of the recent interest in the tin mineral lodes immediately around southern Kelly Bray. Cornwall Resources Ltd who control the mineral resources in the local area expect to commence drilling in the spring. A total of around twenty holes are currently planned and to depths of up to 500 metres. The drilling programme is expected to take about six months. Local landowners are currently being contacted concerning access to their land. Cornwall Resources Ltd are also in discussions with Cornwall Council, Callington Town Council and Kelly Bray Residents Association concerning the planned drilling programme.

Following discussions with local Councillors, a meeting in the Town Hall is being scheduled for February but a date is yet to be confirmed. It is the intention to invite various professionals such as an Estate Agent, experienced in selling property within a mining area, and an Insurance Advisor to advise property owners within the exploratory area.

CALLINGTON GOES PURPLE FOR POLIO

As I sit and write this article the thousands of purple crocuses that have been planted in and around Callington are starting to spring up. Hopefully by the time you read this they will have started to bloom.

Rotary International has been involved with a program to eradicate polio for over thirty years. In that time the number of polio cases reported in the world has dropped from a 1000 cases a day to only 44 this year so far. Polio is now only affecting Afghanistan, Pakistan and Nigeria.

The colour purple has been chosen because when children are vaccinated their little finger is marked with purple dye. The purple crocuses are planted to act as a reminder of this action. So hope you will enjoy seeing them 'turning Callington purple' soon.

Callington Rotary Club would like to thank everyone who gave a donation towards this cause at our stalls in Honey Fair, Victorian Market and also by purchasing crocus corms in Pridhams Electrical. It is amazing that for every £1 donated the Bill and Melinda Gates foundation will donate £2. Money is still being received but donation received so far are in the region of £300 so that will be worth £900 to the charity End Polio Now.

This is an ongoing campaign with the aim to eradicate polio completely. From the time the last polio case is reported in 2016 it will take three years of continued immunisation before the world can be declared free of Polio.
