flourishing future for our town, safe from developments which could be detrimental to us.

The entire process will conclude with a referendum among the residents of Callington, so it is vital that every aspect of the plan meets with residents' approval.



Early attendances are good with a real cross section of visitors, those on “personal missions” who pursue unrelentingly their task of identifying long lost family and connections, those with a professional interest, those who just wish to browse the hundreds of photos on display. And what a display! Very colourful with our “Carnival Queen and her attendant” looking resplendent overlooked by “Nemo”.

Callington Lions have kindly allowed us access to their “Honey Fair” archive and this aspect of Town life is on display in one of the glass cabinets.

For those with a geological bent Mark Tamblyn paid a visit to Kelly Bray’s own Klondike to record and take photos of the exploratory drilling in the vicinity, this is not just taking place on the mine site itself, but in surrounding fields. This presumably with a view to hit on promising seams. Following his visit, we were in turn visited by University Students who were engaged in and assisting in the process.

Our thanks must go to Callington Singers whose Concert and Workshops in St Mary’s in April by all accounts was a big success, thanks were due as proceeds were pledged to The Heritage Centre, for which we naturally are very grateful. Although a decision has not yet been made, one option for this windfall will be to update our IT capabilities with which we have been struggling for some time.

Thanks to our Town Council we now have a new sign adjacent to the entrance, this at least indicates our presence and whether anyone is at home, however I still subscribe to the view that a banner strategically placed near say a roundabout would at least give early warning and an option to stop off for passing motorists.

A recent singing workshop at Callington St. Mary's Church has raised the sum of £700 for the Callington Heritage Centre.

On Saturday 29th April the Callington Singers offered the opportunity to spend a day learning and performing some of the Greatest Hits of Choral music, including works by Handel, Mozart, Haydn, Vaughan Williams and many others.
