

LEST WE FORGET



As Armistice Day and Remembrance Sunday draw closer, have you ever wondered about the significance of the poppy as the symbol of the Royal British Legion, or the two minute silence held on Armistice Day?

In the spring of 1915, shortly after losing a friend in Ypres, Canadian doctor Lieutenant Colonel John McCrae was inspired by the sight of the poppies growing in battle-scarred fields to write the now famous poem *In Flanders' Fields*. His poem moved American teacher Moina Michael who began making and selling silk poppies to friends to raise money for the ex-service community.

Before long, poppies made their way to the UK and became the symbol of the Royal British Legion when it was formed in 1921. Later that year, the first ever Poppy Appeal raised over £106,000 for war veterans. The following year, a poppy factory was set up giving jobs to disabled former servicemen. The bright red poppy is regarded as a resilient flower which managed to flourish despite fields being destroyed by war.

The first Remembrance Day in Britain and the Commonwealth was held in 1919. King George V issued a proclamation calling for a two minute silence, it said: "All locomotion should cease, so that, in perfect stillness, the thoughts of everyone may be concentrated on reverent remembrance of the glorious dead." The two minute silence is observed on Armistice Day, the day which marks the end of World War I, at the eleventh hour on the eleventh day of the eleventh month.

Callington's Remembrance Service will take place in St Mary's Church on Sunday 12th November at 3.00pm. Participants are asked to gather in the Town Hall from 2.15pm, the parade will set off for the War Memorial at 2.30pm for the wreath laying ceremony. There will be refreshments in the Town Hall after the service. **Everyone is welcome**

*In Flanders' Fields the poppies blow
Between the crosses, row on row,
That mark our place: and in the sky
The larks, still bravely singing fly
Scarce heard amid the guns below*

*We are the dead. Short days ago
We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow,
Loved and were loved, and now we lie
In Flanders' Fields.*

*Take up our quarrel with the foe;
To you from failing hands we throw
The torch; be yours to hold it high
If ye break faith with us who die
We shall not sleep, though poppies
grow
In Flanders' Fields.*

REFRESHING PROJECT

A new Callington Town Council sub-committee has been formed to allow the project to reinvigorate the Callington mural trail.

The remit of the sub-committee will be to work on behalf of Callington Town Council to fulfil the objectives as laid out below by applying for grant funding in order to work alongside professional artists to execute the necessary work.

Objectives

- To make Callington a destination based on public works of art;
- To engage the community with the murals;
 - To restore existing murals;
 - To replace existing murals;
 - To generate new murals.

The outline plan is to raise awareness of the intrinsic value of the murals; raise funds to support a small-scale mural competition; agree a mechanism for making grant applications; run the competition; carry out a visual review of the existing murals; identify lost murals and create a listing and categorise; scope the necessary work to save those murals which are salvable and investigate possible funding sources to carry out the restoration of murals and complete the work.

Once the first part of the project is complete, it is intended to then apply for funding to generate new murals and launch a new project, which might include aspects of artwork other than murals.

The Committee is looking for anyone within the community who would be interested in joining in this exciting project. You need not have any artistic flair yourself, just the desire to help see the regeneration of the Mural Trail. The first meeting will be held in Callington Town Hall on Monday 6th November at 7.00pm. CALLINGTON U3A

THE VIEW FROM THE WINGS was the title of this month's talk, for the the Callington U3A at the Town Hall, it was by Brian Freeland, his stories about life behind the scenes in the Theatre.

His experiences with everything from variety (Butlin's Holiday Camps and the London Palladium) to the Royal Shakespeare Company, the National Theatre, Scottish Opera and Sadler's Wells Ballet. The stage manager's view from the prompt corner is very different to that from your comfortable seat in the stalls or circle. Reality theatre; no retakes.

Brian's theatre career started direct from National Service, in 1959, as Trainee Manager at the London Palladium, and has taken him to forty-three different countries including three residencies in the Middle East; eight tours of the Indian sub-continent and two circumnavigations of the globe.

He has worked with the Royal Shakespeare Company, the National Theatre, Sadler's Wells and London Festival Ballet Companies, Scottish Opera, Nottingham Playhouse and Joan Littlewood's Theatre Workshop Company.

As he approached retirement he started to 'branch out' - directing amateur operatics; writing scripts, and giving talks. Details of his talks and presentations, and of his scripts, fill the pages of his website, www.brianfreeland.co.uk In amongst all of this he finally found time to write the long-promised autobiography which he called MEANDERINGS: A RIVER AND A LIFE. Again, details can be found towards the back of the website.

Brian worked with some very famous names such as Bud Flanagan and the Crazy Gang, Harry Secombe, Tommy Trinder, Derek Nimo, David Jason, Sybil Thorndyke and many more. He told us some very funny stories of things that went wrong back stage. It was a very amusing talk, enjoyed by all.

The Local Governing Board (LGB) of Callington Community College seeks new Governors. It would be great if you would consider taking up this opportunity to support the children in our area.

Governors are unpaid volunteers – parents, staff, members of the local community - who commit their time and expertise to making a real difference to the outcomes of local children.

'Effective governance provides strategic direction and control to schools... It creates robust accountability, oversight and assurance for their educational and financial performance and is ambitious for all children and young people to achieve the very best outcomes.' (Dept for Education)

A Governor's role: The LGB contributes to key areas, such as:

- Setting the College's vision, ethos and strategic direction
- Holding the Principal to account for the educational performance of the College and its students; and
- Overseeing the financial performance of the College and making sure its money is well spent.

How much time you should aim to put in: Ideally, this entails a regular commitment of two or more hours per week in term time (including monitoring in school, liaising with fellow governors etc) - which includes attending two or three meetings per term.

If you are interested: If you feel you could make a positive contribution to the governance of the College, please get in touch. You do not need prior experience in education. Expertise in data analysis or finance would be an asset to complement the skills set of current governors, but let us know how you feel you could support the College and we would be pleased to hear from you.

In the first instance, please contact our Clerk (details below). If you are new to the College, we can arrange a visit and an introductory chat with one of our Governors; if you are already familiar with the College and would like to move the process along we will ask you to complete a skills audit form and submit a personal profile.

All appointments are subject to safeguarding checks and suitability. Governors are entitled to time off work (unpaid) to fulfil their duties, and are crucial to the success of schools - so please do consider applying.






